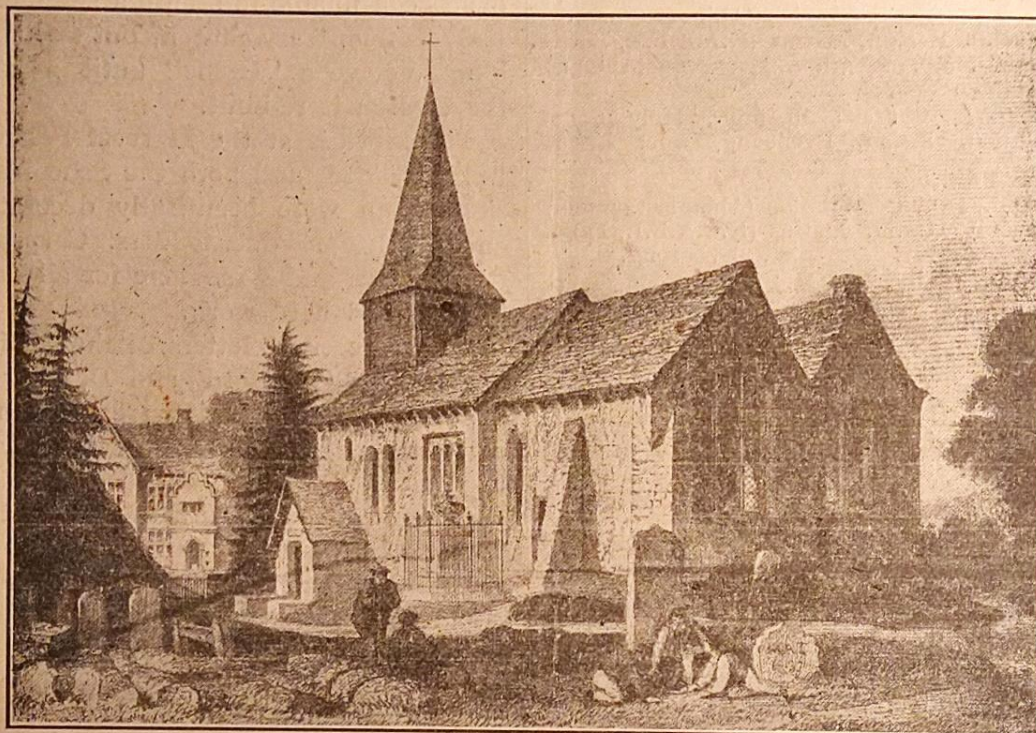

MY DEAR PEOPLE,

I am indeed grateful for your generous response to our appeal on behalf of the Church Rebuilding Fund, which has nearly reached £700. A copy of Mr. Gibbs' leaflet, etc., giving a full account of the destruction of the Church, together with letter, should by now have reached all of you. If by any chance anyone has been omitted by mistake please let me know, and I will immediately forward further copies, and I shall be only too pleased to let anyone have leaflets to send to any of your friends who would be interested. Don't forget that Mr. Gibbs' excellent booklet on the history of the Church can be obtained for 2s. 6d. (proceeds to be given to the Rebuilding Fund). There are only a limited number of these in hand, and you will be wise to secure one as soon as possible. You will be glad to hear that the Church Council, with the full approval of the Diocesan authorities, have appointed Mr. Frederick Etchells as architect for restoring the Church. Mr. Etchells has lately restored two churches in Sussex, West Dean and Donnington, and members of our Church Council, together with myself, have visited these churches, and were fully satisfied with the architect's skill and taste.

As soon as Mr. Etchells has had time to go fully into the matter he will submit his plans to the Church Council, and a meeting of all parishioners will be called, so that everyone will have a chance to know what is proposed.

I am sorry to say that up to the present we have been unable to secure a suitable hut for use as a temporary church, but we hope before long to have a "Home" until such time as the Church is re-built.

The services at the Harvest Festival were well attended, and both the School and Mission Room were beautifully decorated, and our thanks are due to Mrs. Carpenter and the children and Mrs. Bone for all their kind interest and hard work.

I have received letters of thanks from the hospitals at Guildford and Dorking saying how grateful they both were for the large amount of fruit and vegetables we were able to send them.

I hope by next month to be able to report that we have secured our temporary Church at Abinger Common.
