Inscriptions Inside the Church⁴

West Window of the Nave

1. In the glass: "To the Glory of God and in loving memory / of Anne Hill / this window was / given by her son T. P. Hill / Rector 1880"⁵

South Wall of the Nave

2. West side of the door. A double grey marble tablet, on the eastern half. "In a Vault / Underneath Lye the / Body of Mr. Johannes Worsfold of Folles / Green in this Parish / who Departed this Life / August ye 15th 1761 aged 41 years / Here also lyeth the Body of / Mrs. Elizabeth Worsfold / widow of the late Mr. / John Worsfold of the same / Place who Departed this life / April ye 8th 1763 Aged 80 years".⁶
- 2a. On the Western half: "In the same / Vault also lies interred the Body / of Mr. Richard Rowzier / who departed Life the 9th / Day of May 1767 aged 22 / years /. Here also Lyeth the Body of / Mrs. Elizabeth Rowzier who departed this Life / June 17th. 1785 / aged 63 years".⁷
- 3⁸. East side of the door - on a white marble tablet with grey marble back. "Sacred to the memory of / Commodore William Robinson / of the Bombay Marine / who in the year 1774 commanded a small squadron / fitted out by the Bombay Government for the purpose of / exploring the Coast of the Indian Ocean / from the mouth the Indus to the Persian Gulf / a survey which had not been attempted / since a similar voyage was undertaken / for the same purpose / by Nearchus in the time of Alexander / and to which Dr. Vincent / the learned translator of the voyage of Nearchus acknowledges himself to have been much indebted / in the performance of that work. / Having obtained an honourable independence in the service of the East India Company / he retired to Abinger Hall in this Parish. He died in London in March 1803 aged 57 years / and is buried in a vault in this church. / This simple tribute / is offered to his memory by one of those / who were indebted to the kindness of his disposition / for many of the enjoyments of their childhood / and is also intended to fulfil / what would have been the wishes of others / who can now no longer express them / but who would have cordially joined / in this record by their sense of his worth as a man / and of his service as a friend."⁹

4. West side of the 3 light window near the pulpit. On a bronze tablet on green marble back: "To the sacred memory / of / Flora Louise Lady Lugard D. B. E. / beloved wife of / Frederick Dealtry Lord Lugard who died at Little Parkhurst / January 25th 1929 / I thank my God upon every remembrance of you".¹⁰
5. On a brass tablet under the last: "To the Glory of God / and in loving memory of / William Anthony Mitchison / Lieut Royal Engineers / killed in action near Ypres / 20th Sept. 1917 aged 24".¹¹
6. On a brass under the same 3 light window. "In memory of John Carby Thompson / of Inholm obiit July MDCCCLXXII".¹²
7. On a brass on the wall under the last. "In loving memory of / Evelyn Arthur / third son of / John Arthur and E. Gertrude Franck Gibbs / of Goddards in this parish / who died 7 July 1917 aged 11 years / He being made perfect in a short time fulfilled a long time / for his soul pleased the Lord. Wisdom Ch. IV".¹³
8. On a marble tablet under the last. "The lectern was dedicated in this Church 8 Oct. 1899 / to the Glory of God and the beloved memories of Florence Bayly and Walter Ker / her only son who fell in action May 1897 aged 22 / Given by her daughter and sisters A.D. 1899 / Thy word is a lamp unto my feet and a light unto my faith".¹⁴
9. In the glass of the above mentioned 3 light window. In the eastern light: Above "Fides", below "Be thou faithful / unto death and / I will give thee a crown of life". In the middle light: Above "Caritas", below "The end of the commandment is char[ity] / out of a pure heart" [and of a good conscience and] of faith unfeigned" (Timothy 1 1.5). In the western light: Above "Spes", below: "And now Lord / what is my hope / truly my hope / is even in Thee".¹⁵

North Wall of the Nave

10. At the west end of the wall and opposite to the door; on a Brass in a curved wooden frame¹⁶. "In grateful memory of those who went out / from this [ecclesiastical] parish and fell in the War of 1914-1918 / Pte. Ernest Andrew Bone / 3rd Surrey Rifles / Lt. Cpl. Herbert Carpenter¹⁷ / 7th The Queens (R.W. Surrey Regt) / 2nd A-M Russell C. Forehead / Royal Air Force / Pte. George Cadd / 1st The Sherwood Foresters / Pte. Thomas Holloway / 1st Hampshire Regt. / Cpl. Herbert William Hunt / 4th Yorkshire Regt. / Grace King / Dames des Cantines Anglaises / Lt. William A. Mitchison / Royal Engineers / Lt. Walter Selwyn Orpen / Xth Lancashire Fusileers / Pte. Ernest A. E. Smith / 4th Royal Fusileers". On the base of the wooden frame of this Brass. "Death is swallowed up in Victory"
11. A Brass next to and east of the last. "To the Glory of God / and in loving memory / of my dear husband / Herbert William Carpenter / 7th Queens Regiment / Schoolmaster of Abinger Council School / who gave

his life for his country / September 29th 1918 aged 33 years / He was strong in faith giving glory to God".

12. A brass next to and east of the last. "Sacred / to the memory of / The Rev. J.C.W. Powe11 / for 27 years rector of this / parish and Rural Dean / Resigned 1877 and died at / Brighton February 25 1881 / His remains lie in a vault in / this churchyard / Them that sleep in Jesus will God bring with him 1 Thess. 4.14 / This tablet is / erected by his parishioners and / friends who valued his faithful / ministry / I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ for it is the / power of God unto salvation to every one that believeth / Rom 1.16 /".¹⁹
13. A Brass on black marble back next to and east of the last engraved at the head with the arms of the deceased. "In memory / of Robert Campbell 2nd Baron Abinger/ born 5th 1794 died June 24th 1861 / at Abinger Hall /. This tablet was erected by his widow / Save us Oh God of our Salvation and / gather us together /. 1 Chronicles 16 chap 35 verse / I. H. S /".²⁰
14. Brass on black marble back beneath the last. "In memory of Sarah Lady Abinger younger daughter of / George Smith Esqre of Ashstead in this County Chief Justice of / the Mauritius widow of Robert Campbell 2nd Baron Abinger / Born October 13th 1803 died June 3rd 1878 / She was buried in a vault in the N. E. angle of this churchyard /. At evening time it shall be light. Zech. CIV. 7 /".
15. A Brass on black marble back next to and east of the last two. "To the Glory of God / and / in memory of / Rev Thomas Prince Hill / for 39 years rector of / this Parish 1877-1916 / During whose time the church was restored and much beautified / This tablet is erected by his parishioners / in token of their appreciation of his long / and faithful ministry in their midst /. Ye being dead yet speaketh."
- 15a. In the glass of each of the 3 Norman windows in the north wall there is "IHS" many timed repeated.²¹

West Wall of the Patron's Chancel

16. A stained glass²² window has in the glass "St. Margaret" above and below. Giving thanks to God / for Rose W. Redgrave²³ / born Oct. 3 1811 died / Novr. 23rd 1899. At Rest"
17. On a brass under the above window: "In loving memory of / Gilbert Bacon Redgrave / Major R. A. F. / younger son of G. R. Redgrave and his wife who died / October 23rd 1924 aged 40. Thou has made me glad through thy works".²⁴

18. On a brass on the south side of the last: "To the dear memory of Richard Redgrave²⁵ C.B. R.A / born 30 April 1804 died 14 December 1888 / Who spent thirty six summers in this Village looking through Nature up to Nature's God / Make him to be numbered with thy Saints in glory everlasting".²⁶
19. On a bronze tablet on north side of the last one: "In affectionate remembrance of Emma²⁷ wife of Gilbert Redgrave / She spent many hours in / Abinger and died at Sydenham Jan / 14th 1914 in the 64th year of her age".²⁸
- 19a. Under No. 17. A bronze tablet with white lettering: "In affectionate memory of / Frances Margaret/ elder daughter of Richard Redgrave R.A. C.B. / born September 1845 died March 7th 1932 / and of Evelyn Leslie Redgrave / younger sister of the above / born November 29th died March 23rd 1932. They were lovely and pleasant in their lives / and in their death they were not divided".²⁹

North Wall of the Patron's Chancel

20. Under a marble portrait sculpture in the wall is carved: "Alistair Ian Mackenzie / son of Sir Alexander Mackenzie / K.C.S.I. / Placed here by his mother." And on the arch of the recess in which the monument is placed: "He giveth his beloved sleep". On the sculpture is "Albert Toft" [the artist].

East end of the Patron's Chancel

21. In the Glass³⁰ of 3 light window. The northern light has "SCS Petrus Apost."; the middle one "SCS Jacobus Apost."; the Southern one "SCS Johannes Apost."
22. On the frame³¹ of an oil painting³² under the above window: "The entombment of Christ after Francia (Francesco Raibolini) 1450-1518. The Gift of Colonel T. H. Lewin of Parkhurst to / Abinger Church June 1908".³³
23. On the ends of the 6 pews at the east end of the Patron's Chancel are carved alternately, entwined initials "W.J.E." and a griffin passant and ducally gorged. The former no doubt represents William John Evelyn of Wotton (1822-1908) Patron of the living of Abinger, the latter is the crest of the Evelyn family.

South Wall of the Nave

24. A brass above the pulpit engraved at the head with the arms of the deceased: "General the Honble. Sir James Yorke / Scarlett G.C.B. born Feb. 29 1799 died / Dec. 6 1871³⁴. He was the

second son of James / first Lord Abinger. Entered into the Army a Cornet / in the 18th Hussars³⁵ A.D. 1819. Lt. Col. of the / 5th. D.Gds. A.D. 1840. In command of the heavy / Brigade of Cavalry in the Crimea A.D. 1854 / On Oct. 25th of the same year led into action / that gallant force which gained a victory / over the Light Russian Cavalry at / Balaclava. Was wounded twice in the / celebrated charge. On his return to England / he was appointed Governor of Portsmouth / and afterwards Adjutant General and to the / command of Troops at Aldershot /. He died at Bank Fell in Lancashire and was / buried at Holme Chapel near Burnley in that Co.”.

25. A brass in the Sanctuary engraved at the head with the arms of the deceased. “James Scarlett first Baron Abinger / whose remains rest in a vault in the / angle of this churchyard born in Jamaica / Dec. 15 1769 died at Bury St. Edmunds / April 7 1844. Lineally descended from an ancient family of English Gentry. James Scarlett was educated at Trin. Coll. Cam. and called to the Bar. In the honourable / profession of the Law he deservedly gained / the highest reputation and celebrity / He took office on two occasions as the King’s Attorney General and in 1834 accepted the / post of Lord Chief Baron of the Exchequer / and was raised to the Peerage. He died in / discharge of his duties whilst Judge of Assize.”³⁶
26. A white marble tablet above the last. “To the beloved memory of / Louise Henrietta³⁷ wife of Sir James Scarlett knight / of Abinger Hall in this parish / daughter of Peter Campbell of Kilmory in Argyle Esqre. / She departed this life on the 8th day of March A D. 1829 / in the 58th year of her age / Her remains are deposited in a vault / in the north east angle of the churchyard / Her devotion as a wife / her affection as a mother her unaffected piety / and the rectitude of all her actions and sentiments / live in the recollections of her husband / her children and her friends.”³⁸
27. In the glass³⁹ of stained glass window (Crucifixion) in the south wall near the altar. “To the beloved memory of / Frances Carleton Bayly⁴⁰ / died Dec. XV A.D. MDCCCLXIV / aged LXXII years. In Peace”.
- 27a. On the riser of the Sanctuary steps: “This do in remembrance of me”.
- 27b. On the gap ends of the Communion rails.^{41 42} On the south rail “In remembrance of M[uriel] Wynn Williams [died] 1923 RIP”. On the north rail “in remembrance of I[sabel] Wynn Williams [died] 1933 RIP”.

On the Floor of the Sanctuary

Against the east wall (under the altar) are two black marble slabs side by side inscribed as follows:

28. The Southern one: "Under this stone is interred / the Body of the Reverend Mr. / Robert Offley near fifty / three years Rector of this Parish / and oldest Prebendary of the / Cathedral Church of Durham / greatly esteemed and beloved / for his Benevolence Charity / and Hospitality / He exchanged this life for a better / the 10th day of May 1743 /".⁴³
29. The Northern on: "Here lyeth ye Body / of Mr. Thomas Crawley Rector / of this Parish son of Francis / Crawley Esqre. Cursitor Baron / of his Majesty's Exchequer / He departed this life / the 4th day of May anno Dom 1685".⁴⁴ "Here also lyeth y^e Body of / Mrs. Elizabeth Crawley relict of / y^e said Thomas Crawley and daughter of Gabriel Ottley D. D. Chaplain / to his Majty. King Charles y^e 2^d /, who died March 1677/8".

Organ Chamber

30. In glass⁴⁵ of lancet stained glass window in the South wall – The Ascension "A.W." above, "I.H.S." below.
31. Brasses beneath the above window pane. "In honorem Dei / Dono dedit Montagu Bayly 1857 / The Rev. Montagu Bayly A .M. / who to the glory of God gave this window A.D. 1857 / died in the peace of God March 24th A.D. 1859 aged 34 years/. In thy light shall we see light".
- 31a. On a brass plate on the Organ: "A. Kirkland, London"

Space between Organ Chamber and "Old Vestry"

32. A brass under the lancet stained glass window in the south wall (Our Lord in Glory, hand raised in blessing). "In memory of / James Henry Lawrence Scarlett⁴⁶ / younger son of Lord Abinger / born Janry 19 1830 died June 15th 1845. I shall rise again"⁴⁷ (in a separate brass beneath the other).⁴⁸
33. Brass on the south wall of the said space (partly concealed by the organ) reads: "The East window⁴⁹ / erected to the memory of / James 1st Baron Abinger / by his eldest son."
34. A framed inscription (about 5 x 4 feet) on the east wall of the space between the organ chamber and the "old vestry":
"Charitable Donations and Bequests to the Poor of this Parish.
Year 1613 Henry Spooner⁵⁰ of Abinger yeoman by / will dated the 5th day of January 1613 / left the Poor of the Parishes of Abinger / and Ockley one annuity or yearly rent / of 20/- to be issuing out of / his

The Poor of this Parish are entitled to / a portion of Mr. Smith's Charity ⁵¹ the annual amount of which varies. It is due at Michaelmas and is to be distributed accor / ding to the Trust deeds and Will in Clothes Bread and Flesh on Sundays /.

1817 Dame Mary Evelyn bequeathed £300 to be laid out in the purchase of 3 per / cent Bank Annuities. The interest to be / distributed annually on Easter Sunday / in Bread. One moiety to the parish of / Abinger the other to the parish of Wot / ton at the discretion of the Rectors / Total of 3 per cent stock purchased 598.16.6 / annual interest £8.19. 7.

Mr. Lawes bequeathed the like sum of £100 for the same purposes after the decease of his widow."

The Old Vestry (built 1879/80)

The Vestry (The new vestry built 1920)

36. A bronze relief plaque of the Crucifixion on the East wall has inscribed in the left hand bottom corner: "C. Diehl / Reproducteur" and low down on the right side "Justin".⁵³
37. Under the above plaque is a Brass reading: "This Vestry was erected / in memory of Edwin Waterhouse / of Feldemore / who died 17th September 1917" (The Vestry was given by his widow).

41. Next to it, nine paces from the north wall: "... / day of June, the / year of our Lord 1701 / Let him deny himself and take / up his cross daily and follow me".
42. One pace beyond the gallery front and eight paces from the north wall: "Here lyeth the body of / Henry Worsfold yeoman / who departed this life / the 11th day of March 1721 / in the 59 year of his age".⁵⁷
43. Seven paces from the west wall and the same distance from the north wall: "Here lieth the body of / John G. (sic) son of / Robert G. (sic) Gentr / and Elizabeth his wife / who departed this life / the 2d. of April / in the year of our Lord / 1729 in the 20th year of his age. / Grieve not for me / Because my race is run / It is the Lord / And let His will be done".⁵⁸

In the Rector's Chancel

44. In the Rector's chancel two paces from the north wall, one and a half from the E. end; "Richard Ronzier⁵⁹ Esq. / obiit Jan. ye 11th 1744 / ætatis suae 73. Mary Hamilton⁶⁰ / Daughter of the above died / Feb. 17, 1782, aged 65 years. Mr. Richard Ronzier⁶¹ / died Aug. ye 18th 1757 / aged 45 years. Willm. Hamilton Esq.⁶² / of Tottenham in the county of / Middlesex husband of the / above. Mary Hamilton / died Sept. 29, 1800 / aged 73 years".

Nearest the south wall was the black marble stone with the name of Thomas Crawley. Dr. Offley's joined it and between Dr. Offley's and Mr. Ronzier's was a Purbeck stone without any inscription (See Nos. 28 and 29 above).

In the Patron's Chancel

In the Patron's Chancel, at the distance of nine paces from the East end, and four from the South side, were two black marble stones, lying side by side, and thus inscribed:

45. "Here lyes the body of Alice⁶³ the late wife / of John Dibble Esq. who departed this / life July the 5th 1712. Aged 43 years".
46. "Here lies the body of Daniell Dibble / Gent. who deceased ye 4th of Aprill / 1702. Aetatis suae 84".
"Here also lies the body of Susannah the / wife of Daniel Dibble Gent. who / deceased February the 22nd 1709/10 /. Aetatis Suae 87."
47. "In the same chancel, six paces from the West end, in the middle of the passage a purbeck stone with a small square panel incised from which the brass had been abstracted.

In the Nave – again

48. In the nave, seven paces from the chancel and the same number from the South wall, on a Purbeck stone: "Here under lyeth the body of Mrs. Jane Alexander wife of the Rev. Charles / Alexander, late Vicar of Oakwood / Chapel who departed this life the 20th / day of February in the year of our Lord / 1723. Aged 76 years."

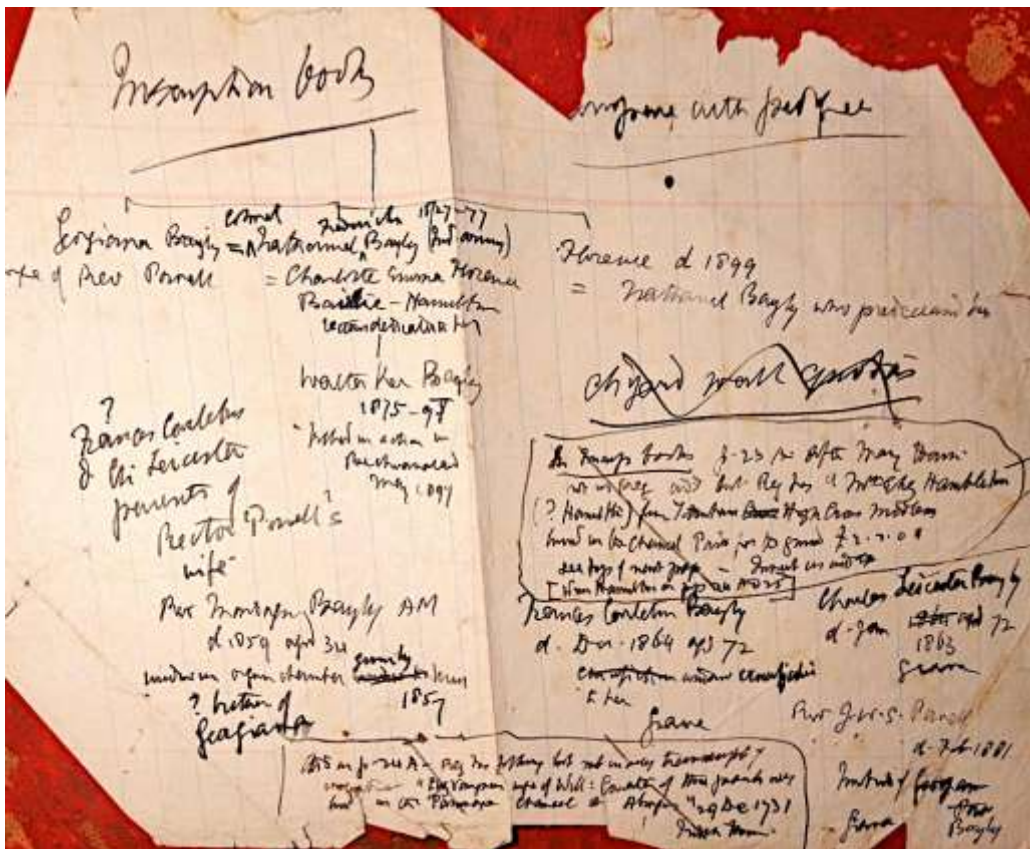

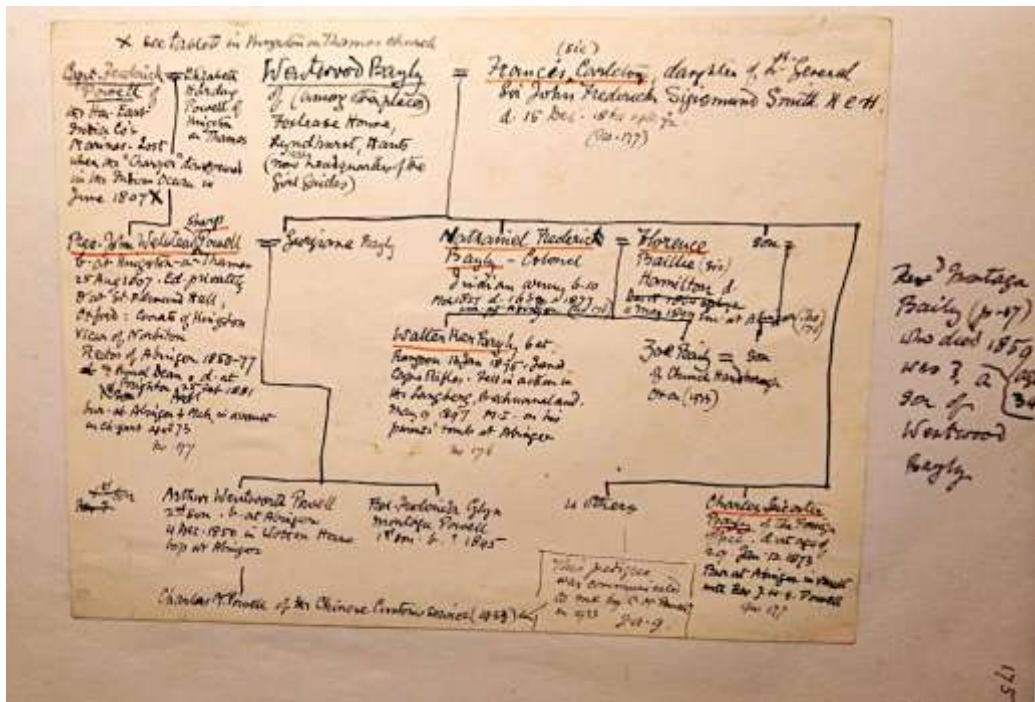

Appendix E: Rights in Churchyard

CHURCHYARD LAW
Times 16 Nov 1933
CHANCELLORS' ADVICE TO INCUMBENTS

The following memorandum on "the Legal Position of the Incumbent in regard to the Churchyard" has been issued by the Diocesan Chancellors' Committee:—

The strict right of a parishioner in the churchyard is simply the right to interment. The erection of a tombstone or monument over a grave, though now customary, remains a privilege. It is an erection on consecrated ground, and therefore in strictness requires the grant of a faculty, but where the incumbent consents a faculty is not in practice insisted on. The incumbent, in giving or refusing such consent, is not acting on behalf of the ordinary: nor is he exercising the functions of a judge. He has the primary right by reason of his position as incumbent to refuse this privilege unless sanctioned by a faculty.

His refusal should always be with reference to the particular case, and on the lines that he must require a faculty because he considers that particular monument unsuitable to that particular churchyard. If asked why he considers it unsuitable he should give his reasons, which would presumably be either on account of its size, its shape, or its material, but always with reference to that particular churchyard. In this way he might well be acting on the advice given in the recently published Notes on the Care of Churchyards, and there is no reason why he should not do so, provided he does not treat such notes as of binding authority. Having regard to the painful circumstances in which the question generally arises, and which often create sympathy for the parishioners involved, it is desirable that the parochial church council should assist the incumbent in performing this difficult duty by passing a resolution to the effect that they adopt generally for their churchyard the principles laid down in such notes and will support the incumbent in acting upon them.

If the matter comes before the Consistory Court on an application for a faculty, the Judge has to exercise a judicial discretion in accordance with ecclesiastical law. The incumbent has no such judicial discretion. In refusing to allow a memorial he is not deciding a case against the applicant, but is merely referring him to the proper tribunal dealing with the subject. He incurs no liability, but transfers the responsibility to the proper shoulders.

Inscriptions are on the same footing, except that objections to them would seldom be with reference to a particular churchyard, but on some more general ground of unsuitability.

SHEEP IN CHURCHYARDS

Sir—May I support "W. B.'s" words in your issue of November 24 about untidy churchyards? In olden days—not so very long ago either—our churchyards were kept neat and beautiful by allowing sheep to crop the grass from time to time. By an inverted "reverence" popular opinion is now against this simple and sound practice. This would not matter if the parishioners were willing to provide the means for cutting the churchyard grass regularly. But in the majority of country parishes the Churchfolk adopt the obscurantist attitude of neither allowing the grass to be sheep-cut nor paying for it to be hand-cut. The result is huge shocks of rank grass and weeds all over the place, hiding the tombs and making the church walls damp and in time unsafe.

Will the country clergy do their utmost to bring their people once more in favour of sheep feeding in churchyards and point out that there is nothing whatever irreverent in allowing God's creatures to pasture in God's acre? Indeed the irreverence lies in the present view, by allowing God's acre to be unkempt.

Dear Mr Gibbs,

I found your very kind letter awaiting me here when I returned to town on Saturday. Many thanks for it, and for the new information which it contains. It will be very useful.

From your clear description of the site I had no difficulty in finding Mr Hoole's grave "between 2 buttresses on the N. wall". I copied the whole of the inscription & the headstone: and (unless I copied you entirely wrong) there is a small error in your own transcription. The date of Elizabeth's death is "July 31st 1794" — not 1791. The last figure is somewhat obliterated & looks rather like a 1 at a little distance. — The "Bible text" is also rather curious. The words do not seem to occur in the A.V., and are, I think,

reaplace of Psalm. 39.7. (?)

As I think I told you, I wrote a book on Keenwook some years ago (1932), and Samuel Hoole is the only man who has ever published an English edition of this great Dutchman's works — hence my own interest in him. Hoole's "Select Works" (2 vols. 4". 1798, 1807 — and later issues) are far from complete (as their title implies), but as far as they are excellent. Almost nothing appears to be known about the man himself; but my searches led me to suppose that he was a clergyman, & that he once resided at Abinger — all of which, with your kind assistance, is now confirmed. I hope to write something about him someday, and if I do will send you a copy. Meanwhile I enclose an old prospectus of my own book (now out of print) which will indicate my own interests. — Hoole is not in the D.N.B., or elsewhere — so far as I can discover; but I have several other clues to follow up.
